HOST has helped many individuals find their way back to secure housing. Here is one of their stories.

Mom and her 6-yearold daughter arrive in Ames. Mom fled an abusive relationship out of state and the pair found their way to lowa. They arrive in town with nowhere to go.

Their journey starts with staying at The Bridge Home.

The Bridge Home provides Emergency Shelter to over 2,500 people annually. People seeking shelter come from many different backgrounds and experiences.

Of households experiencing homelessness in Story County, 43% include at least one child.



Mom enrolls her daughter in the Ames Community School District and connects with the school's Family Resource Support Advocate, who is also the Homeless Liaison for the district. The Student and Family Advocate is part of the HOST Service Provider Meetings.

HOST starts connecting with mom multiple times each week. HOST helps provide clothing for the daughter to wear to school and for mom to wear to job interviews. Each public school district is required to appoint a staff person to serve as the Homeless Education Liaison. This ensures a child experiencing homelessness has access to the same programs and services as all other students.

HOST assists mom with applying for housing programs like Central Iowa Regional Housing Authority (CIRHA), Eastwood of Ames, and Home For Awhile.

Mom lands a stable job and starts working.

In Story County, 39% of households pay more than 30% of their income on housing.

Story County has a shortfall of affordable housing units.

HOST connects mom with Together for Good. They are able to help with crisis hosting, respite care, and mentoring.

Boys and Girls Club provides childcare for the summer. HOST requests a scholarship for the daughter and she receives coverage for the entire \$200 membership fee.

Together for Good connects volunteers from local churches with parents and vulnerable children. Volunteers host children during moments of crisis, for shorter periods of time as respite relief, and help support parents through relationship building.

Boys and Girls Clubs of Story County provides after school and summer care for 6-18 year olds.

In 2025, they served 206 kids in their Summer Club program. Approximately 40 of those kids received a scholarship this summer.

Mom is diligent and calls the ACCESS shelter many times a week to ask about openings. After many weeks, coming close to her exit date at The Bridge Home, there is an opening with ACCESS. Mom and daughter move to the ACCESS domestic violence shelter.

While staying at the ACCESS shelter, HOST continues to help mom apply for the Home for Awhile program. They are selected as the June recipient family.

HOST helps mom and daughter move from the shelter to their Home for Awhile apartment.

The HOST team continue to help support the family and navigate their journey to permanent housing.



So far, HOST has helped 31 households like this family move into housing of their own.

# Monday

Outreach at Ames Public Library from 11 am to 1 pm. As HOST becomes more established, there has been an increase in the number of requests for assistance.

# Thursday

Street outreach day. This starts with outreach to individuals, like checking on people at their residences. Most outreach time is spent at the Romero House.

# Tuesday

The HOST steering committee meets to plan for the Friday meeting. Lists of requested items are prepared so they can be submitted for purchase.

# Friday

HOST and community partners meet to discuss individual needs. This is an opportunity for the larger group to use a team approach to provide support to those in need.
