

CRISIS CANINE JOINS THE AMES POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Ames Police Department recently welcomed its newest member, Penny, a Crisis Response K9 to work alongside her handler, Sgt. Amber Christian. Penny's role is to provide comfort and emotional support in a variety of challenging situations.

Penny's duties include supporting first responders, assisting in victim interviews, responding to major traumatic events or disasters, and offering reassurance to patients in medical facilities. Penny has spent the past several months training at Anna Childs K9 Training, where she has learned obedience, public access skills, and ways to help ease anxiety and emotional distress.

"Penny has learned to instinctively approach individuals showing signs of distress," said Sgt. Christian. "She sits beside them or lies at their feet. That simple act can help people feel calm and grounded in moments of crisis."

before appraisers

• Appraisers will measure exteriors of

homes, decks, garages, etc., and take updated exterior photos.

- Brief interior inspections conducted with permission. (Interior inspections help verify property condition and accuracy of records.)
- Visits typically occur during weekdays.
- If no one is home, a door tag to schedule an appointment or review your record with a data collector will be left on the front door.

Regular appraisals result in accurate

property data, which ensures:

- Fair market value assessments
- Equitable property taxes
- Reliable information for insurance, loans, estate planning and more

Last year, Ames Electric Services contributed \$4,259 in staff time and materials toward the

cost of administering this program. Mid-Iowa Community Action

> (MICA) shares in the administration of the program by determining the eligibility of households for **Project Share** funds.

Project Share's success is the result of our customers' compassion and generosity. Through your support, Project Share has provided \$568,758 in assistance to 4,635 households since the program's inception in 1990. Q: The 30% tax credit for installing rooftop solar panels is going away on December 31, 2025. What options are there for me to invest in solar without this tax credit?

There are many reasons to invest in a home solar system. Ames Electric Services has updated its solar panel rebate and now provides \$500 per kilowatt installed on new solar systems. To speak in terms of an average roof, households typically install solar panel systems that are between 4 and 7 kilowatts. That's \$2,000 to \$3,500 back to you! If your array generates excess electricity, Ames Electric Services will purchase it from you at a set rate per kilowatt. This rate is determined every January. Also, solar panels are exempt from sales tax, which saves you an additional 7% on the total.

Curious how much energy your home would generate with solar panels? Use Project Sunroof, software powered by Google, to calculate potential energy production, savings, and financing scenarios tailored specifically to your address. (Project Sunroof: https://sunroof.withgoogle.com)

If installing solar panels on your home isn't an option, consider purchasing a share of the Ames' community solar farm through our SunSmart Program! Each share, or "Power Pack," represents 175W of generation capacity. After Dec. 10, Power Packs are \$210 each.

Residents who own a Power Pack will receive a small monthly credit on their utility bill. It should be noted that people typically do not purchase a Power Pack to generate money, but to support green and renewable energy production.



Fun Fact about SunSmart: The Ames solar farm partners with Sheep On the Go, a program that provides sheep to graze under and around the solar panels! Additionally, Iowa State University collaborates with Ames Electric Services to advance agrivoltaics – the dual use of land for solar production and agriculture – at the Airport Road solar farm. ISU has planted native plants, is monitoring bees, and has produced honey!
